Tree and Product Descriptions

Eastern White Pine (3-5"): Fast growing to 100 feet. A five-needled pine, with soft 4 in. light green-blue needles. Makes an excellent ornamental as well as a Christmas or timber tree. Pines respond well to pruning and grow well in a wide variety of soils.

Colorado Blue Spruce (5-9"): Grows 60 to 100 feet. Produces stiff silver-blue needles about 1 inch in length. It is known as the 'king of ornamentals' and will create great wind-breaks if planted densely in a row. This spruce can tolerate most soil types and prefers low to medium moisture.

Norway Spruce (6-9"): Grows to 75 feet. Shiny, dark green 1 in. needles on spreading branches. Spruces are extremely hardy trees that are successful in most conditions. Suited for Christmas tree use and as an ornamental evergreen. They are also great for forming a protective windbreak.

American Arborvitae (4-7"): Grows to 50 feet. Also known as Northern White Cedar, produces medium sized scale-like flattened leaves soft to the touch and bell-shaped cones ½ inch in length. Bark is fibrous. Considered a soft wood. Preferred by deer, rabbits, squirrels, and songbirds for shelter and food.

Sugar Maple (8-12"): Grows to 60 feet. Leaves are 5-lobed and velvety underneath. Seeds are round with wing-like structures that drop from the branches in a 'helicopter' motion. This tree provides food for songbirds, quail, turkeys, chipmunks, squirrels, and other wildlife in addition to maple syrup for human consumption. Prefers moderately-drained soils. Using 48" tree shelters are recommended.

Red Oak (12-18"): Grows to 70-80 feet. Bears acorns making it a great backyard variety that brings in wildlife. Prefers well-drained soils. 48" tree shelter suggested.

Sawtooth Oak (12-16"): Grows to 70 feet. Produces leaves 4-10 inches wide. Bears a significant number of acorns, deemed as a high biomass food source for wildlife. Prefers moderate to well-drained soils. Using 48" tree shelters are recommended.

American Hazelnut (8-12"): Considered a shrub, grows to 10 feet. Flowers from April to May, bears edible nuts enclosed by ragged-edged husks from July to September which are suitable for consumption by humans and wildlife. Can grow in a wide range of soils and in partial to full sun. 24" tree shelter suggested.

Pink Lady Winterberry (10-18"): Considered a shrub, grows 10-15 feet. From June to August, it produces flower clusters, tiny pink fruits are seen September through October. The fruit is preferred by non-migratory songbirds and other wildlife. This plant makes a great addition to any backyard landscape. Using a 24" tree shelter suggested.

Habitat Enhancers *Seed packet coverage =1 oz./125 sq.ft, 8 oz./1,000 sq.ft. Seeds should be spread in sunny locations.

***Showy Native Wildflower & Grass Mix:** This showy, attractive mix of 26 native wildflowers and grass varieties has a high pollinator value for attracting honeybees, butterflies, and other insects. Designed for upland sites with well-drained soils and full sun to semi-shaded areas, also suited well for sites in need of erosion control. Blooms spring through fall in a variety of gorgeous colors. It makes a wonderful addition to any roadside bank, flowerbed, backyard display, or meadow.

***Wildflower Seed Mix (Northeast Perennials and Annuals):** This wildflower mix consists of 30 different species, containing a 1/3 mix of annuals and a 2/3 mix of perennials of both native and naturalized species that provide color throughout the year. Seeds should be spread in sunny locations.

***Butterfly and Hummingbird Seed Mix:** This 29 variety mix produces a diverse variety of annual and perennial flowers in a wide range of vibrant colors, including grasses for cover, that are designed to attract pollinators. Pollinators will benefit from this addition of habitat and will enhance your garden landscape.

24" and 48" Blue-X Tree Shelters: These durable, lightweight shelters give new seedlings needed protection against wildlife while also letting sunlight in for healthy growth.

Tree Shelter Wooden Stakes: These wooden stakes accompany the tree shelters by providing support during the first 3-4 years of seedling growth.

Bluebird Box: These locally hand-built wooden boxes (*built by the West Perry FFA*) feature an over-hanging roof and a recessed bottom with slots for dryness. They also have a swivel front opening for easy cleaning. Attach your box 4-6 feet high on a post facing the nearest tree or shrub, at least 100 yards away from other bird boxes.
