CONIFER TREES—BAREROOT, SOLD IN BUNDLES OF 10

Concolor Fir



(Seedlings arrive 5-8 inches tall) Also known as White Fir. Grows up to 100 feet. This easy to care for evergreen has a gray trunk, silver/blue foliage, and short needles.

Fraser Fir



(Seedlings arrive 5-9 inches tall) Grows up to 60 feet. Soft, dark green foliage. Likes moist, cool, well-drained soil. Does not require full sun.

American Arborvitae



(Seedlings arrive 4-7 inches tall) Grows up to 60 feet. Tall, pyramid shaped tree that requires little care. Great for windbreak or hedge use. Adapts well to shearing and shaping. It has a medium growth rate and prefers full sun.

Norway Spruce



(Seedlings arrive 6-10 inches tall) Grows to 75 feet. Shiny, dark green, 1 in. needles on spreading branches. Hardy trees that are successful in most conditions. Suited for Christmas tree use and as an ornamental evergreen. They are also form protective windbreaks.

DECIDUOUS TREES—BAREROOT, SOLD AS SINGLE SEEDLINGS

(will arrive in a range of sizes between 8-20 inches tall)

Sugar Maple

Grows to 60 feet. This tree provides food for songbirds, quail, turkeys, chipmunks, squirrels, and other wildlife in addition to maple syrup for a tasty treat.



Black Walnut

Grows to 100 feet with large, rich nuts amongst its foliage. Known for high value hardwood that is used to make cabinets and furniture. Nut production within 10 years.



White Oak

Grows to 80 feet. Grows best in deep, loamy, well-drained soil. Known for its wide-spreading branches. Plant in a large space for proper growth.



Persimmon

Grows to 40 feet and roughly 30 feet in width. Consists of white flowers that attract pollinators and edible persimmon fruits for wildlife. More than one tree is needed for pollination.



SHRUBS—BAREROOT, SINGLE SEEDLINGS

Viburnum Arrowwood

Growth up to 15 feet. Contains clusters of white flowers and blue/black berries appear in the fall. Birds are attracted to the blooming flowers as they use this shrub as habitat.



Serviceberry Shadblow

Also known as Juneberry, this shrub grows up to 30 feet. Covered with white flowers and red berry-like fruits that attract birds. Early spring bloomer.



WILDFLOWER SEEDS

*Seed packet coverage =1 oz./125 sq.ft, 8 oz./1,000 sq.ft.



Northeast Perennials and Annuals Mix:

This wildflower mix consists of 30 different species, containing a 1/3 mix of annuals and a 2/3 mix of perennials of both native and naturalized species that provide color throughout the year. Seeds should be spread in sunny locations.



Butterfly and Hummingbird Seed Mix:

This 29 variety mix produces a diverse variety of annual and perennial flowers in a wide range of vibrant colors, including grasses for cover, that are designed to attract pollinators. Pollinators will benefit from this addition of habitat and will enhance your garden landscape.

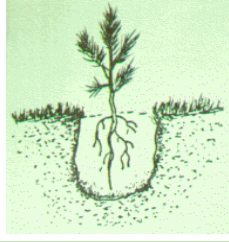

Orders are subject to availability. All seedlings must be purchased by placing a prepaid order. If any one species is sold out, the District will refund payment for those seedlings not available. All seedlings are sold as bareroots and their survival rate varies from site to site, from excellent to poor. We strive to provide the most viable seedlings available and all efforts are made to handle the seedlings in a manner that minimizes root stress. The Perry Conservation District will not ensure successful plantings of bare root seedlings, just as our suppliers will not assure seedling survival. **The District is not responsible for orders not picked up by 6P.M. on April 11, 2024.**

Seedling Care: Do not allow the roots to become dry at any time! Plant seedlings as soon as possible after you receive them. Put the trees in a cool, dry place out of direct sunlight. Do not allow seedlings to freeze or to get above 60 to 65 degrees. If you need to keep the seedlings for a longer period of time, dig a trench in the ground deep enough to cover the roots, place seedlings in trench and cover roots. Be sure to compact the soil so that there are not any air pockets. The seedlings will need to be watered about once per week to make sure they do not dry out. Addition of fertilizer and plant vitamins at the time of planting generally is **not** necessary.



1. Dig a hole twice the size of the roots and deep enough to hold all of the roots.
2. Place the tree in the planting hole as shown in the picture.
3. Fill in the planting hole with soil around the roots. Pack tightly.
4. Place straw or wood mulch around the base of the tree to help keep moisture in.
5. Water the tree well. Give your trees a good soaking with water once a week.
6. Provide protection for your trees with stakes or shelters to prevent damage.

HABITAT ENHANCERS

Oats—Cover Crop Seed



Great for gardeners! When planted after the fall harvest, oats will ‘winter kill’ and provide nutrients and residue for garden plots and raised beds, keeping microbial life fed in the soil over the cold months in prep for spring planting. Oat residue can also be turned under, acting as compost organic matter. The perfect primer for the next production year.

Blue-X Tree Shelters



Comes in both 24" and 48" lengths. These durable, lightweight shelters last for years and give new seedlings needed protection against wildlife while also letting sunlight in for healthy growth. Very quick and easy set-up. **Highly recommended** to be used with seedlings planted in areas with high deer pressure. Wooden stakes are also available for purchase.

Bluebird Boxes



These locally hand-built wooden boxes (*built by the West Perry FFA*) feature an over-hanging roof and a recessed bottom with slots for dryness. They also have a swivel front opening for easy cleaning. Attach your box 4-6 feet high on a post facing the nearest tree or shrub, at least 100 yards away from other bird boxes.
