## Why Recycle?

1. Reduce Illegal Dumping: Perry County has an estimated 107 illegal dump sites as identified by Pa CleanWays in 2008.
2. Conserve Resources: Through steel recycling in 2004, PA conserved 1.3 million tons of iron ore, 718,000 tons of coal and 62,000 tons of limestone\*.
3. Reduce Trash: In 2007, 2.5 million tons of used electronics were discarded. Only about 18 percent (414,000 tons) was collected for recycling\*\*.
4. Increase Jobs: Current recycling and reuse employment in PA is estimated at 81,322 jobs\*.

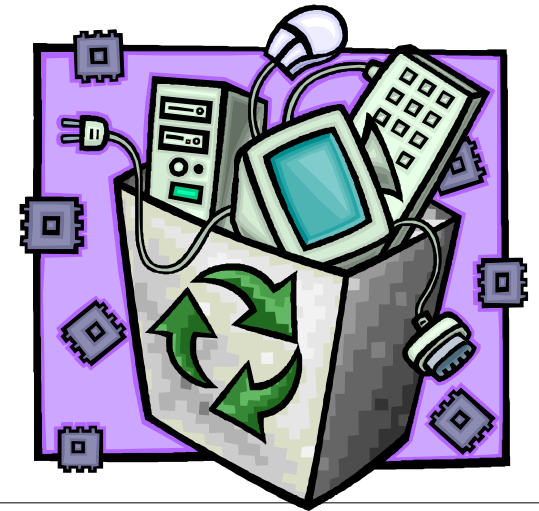

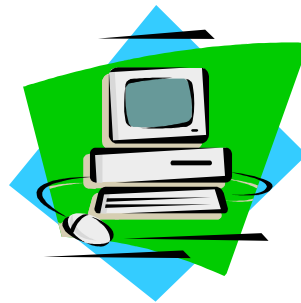
## Ways to keep your electronics out of the trash.

1. Refurbish, fix or upgrade your current systems.
2. Use some of the old parts to build a new system.
3. Donate old electronics to a local charity or school for reuse or refurbishment.
4. Drop off your old electronics to a local recycling program.



## Benefits of e-cycling

- Keeps hazardous substances such as lead and mercury out of the environment.
- Cuts down on the need to mine or purchase materials for new raw materials by reusing valuable materials from old computers.
- Helps others to access electronics they may not be able to afford otherwise.
- Creates jobs for recyclers and refurbishers of electronic goods.
- 95% of materials are recycled in the United States.
